Thank you for your email of 23 January 2024 requesting the following information under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act):

My understanding is that there are Papa Kainga Development discussions taking place at Mahia that may impact on the Nukutaurua 3C3B Block in which I am a shareholder.

I have not been informed formally or informally about any applications or developments by any party involved. My understanding is that other landowners in the Block have not received any information nor been contacted. I am also a Trustee and Secretary for Te Apaapa-a-Rangi Marae, which sits in the Nukutaurua 3C3B Block. Trustees have not been contacted or consulted.

I have received what limited information I have through the kumara vine. This is deeply concerning and leads me to request information regarding any development that will impact Nukutaurua 3C3B under the Official Information Act, 1982.

Please send me copies of all informal or formal written correspondence including, but not limited to emails, letters, text messages and written notes recording verbal conversations or meetings, between 1 January 2022 and 1 January 2024, that refer to:

- Nukutaurua 3C3B
- the gate to the Nukutaurua 3C3B block on Nukutaurua Road
- the dirt road through Nukutaurua 3C3B
- the former paper road through Nukutaurua 3C3B
- Te Apaapa-a-Rangi Marae
- Papa kāinga developments within a 10km radius of Nukutaurua 3C3B

Unfortunately, we do not hold the information you requested, and we cannot think of any other agency that would hold it, or whose functions would be more closely connected to it.

I am therefore refusing your request under section 18(g)(i) of the Act because the information is not held.

You have the right to seek an investigation and review of my response by the Ombudsman, in accordance with section 28(3) of the Act. The relevant details can be found on the Ombudsman's website at: www.ombudsman.parliament.nz.
