This work is the result of a research project funded through MSD's Children and Families Research Fund. The Children and Families Research Fund supports a variety of researchers to access longitudinal Growing Up in New Zealand (GUINZ) data and undertake research that informs priority policy areas. HUD has membership on the GUINZ policy forum. One of HUD's Research and Insights staff met with, provided feedback, reviewed, and coordinated input into this study from the HUD policy team. This study uses statistical methods to look at the overlapping of different aspects of housing quality and the association with various child health outcomes. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The MSD will coordinate the HUD Engagement and Communications and Kāinga Ora communications team regarding the communications approach for the release of this work.

	<p>Information is provided for public and private rentals, compared to owner-occupied dwellings. This work analysed the data from the 2010/11 period, so it is prior to the new policies, such as the Healthy Homes Standards – and this is explicitly noted in the report. MSD has provided a brief to Minister Sepuloni, Minister for Social Development and Employment, with the directive that this be forwarded to Minister Woods and Minister Williams.</p>
