#### 1. Decisions sought this week

#### **Decision/direction sought**

 Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga officials have provided the Minister of Housing two reports on Progressive Home Ownership which we are seeking decisions on.

- Initiation of the Direct to Household Pathway Draft Cabinet paper. We are seeking feedback on the draft Cabinet paper so that we can make changes before ministerial consultation starts on 13 September. Upon completion of the ministerial consultation we will lodge the paper on 23 September for CAB SWC on 29 September.
- Progressive Home Ownership Loan Applications. We are seeking agreement to the proposed loans and for the Minister of Housing to forward the signed briefing to the Minister of Finance by 14 September so he can agree to the loans.


