### Decision/direction sought

#### Local Innovation and Partnership Fund

- Prior to Level 4 lockdown, the PMO indicated that they would advise Minister Davidson of a revised media release date for the Local Innovation and Partnership Fund. We recommend that the media release (provided in draft) and the Fund pre application stage opening are delayed to the week of 30 August 2021 and that the release date of funding decisions is delayed until January 2022. Once dates are confirmed the draft media release will be updated.

Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga knows of at least one application (originally made under HASHAA) that will not be fully processed at the date of repeal.</li> <li>• The partial repeal of HASHAA on 16 September 2019, disestablished all special housing areas (SHAs).
