Housing supply and affordability package

- Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga provided Minister Woods advice and recommendations on the following funds and programmes and is seeking feedback by 9 July. These are:
 - s 9(2)(f)(iv) – policy objectives and implementation
 - Kāinga Ora Land Programme – policy objectives and implementation
 - Land for Housing Programme – changes to settings

Council Housing

- Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga provided Minister Woods with advice on council housing issues and policy options to address them on 1 July. Officials recommend that Minister Woods:
 - s 9(2)(f)(iv)
 - continues to enable councils to have the option of transferring management of their housing to an arm's length Community Housing Provider
 - directs Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga to undertake further analysis to better understand the financial pressures some councils are facing in the provision of their housing.

Unit Titles Act 2010 – amendments to Member's Bill

- Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga provided Minister Williams with advice on proposed amendments to dispute resolution and information and education on 2 July, with feedback requested by 6 July. Officials also intend to provide Minister Williams with proposed amendments to the long-term maintenance planning and funding regime in the Member's Bill on 5 July, with feedback requested by 9 July.

Large Scale Projects

- Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga provided Minister Woods office with a draft press release and proposed location for the announcement of the first tranche of funding for LSPs. Officials are seeking a decision on the proposed approach.

A draft transcript of the hearings has been circulated by the Tribunal for amendment by the parties by 14 July. It is suspected that these will be filed by August or early September. The Tribunal will then prepare its report, which is not likely to be completed until late this year at the earliest. Councillors approved the Spatial Plan with amendments that reduced the size of character precincts, increased the size of walkable catchments from the centre city and rapid transport stops, and removed unlimited heights in the city centre. The approved Spatial Plan is a significant improvement on the draft plan that was consulted on and the revised draft plan presented to councillors.
