Accommodation and settlement options following the evacuation of Afghanistan Following the escalating situation in Afghanistan, the Government announced on 16 August 2021, that it would evacuate New Zealand citizens and permanent residents and their immediate families, as well as Afghan nationals who worked with New Zealand during the two-decade long conflict in Afghanistan, and who may now be at risk. Te Tūāpapa Kura Kāinga has been a part of a cross-agency group tasked with developing interim accommodation and support services for evacuees following their 14-day stay at a Managed Isolation Quarantine facility, and before finding more permanent accommodation solutions.
